1 that is mounted on the ground at Fishel Park. This
 2 plaque, part of the memorial is dedicated to Tim
 3 Bodden, a marine from Downers Grove who was listed as
 4 missing in action in 1967.
 5 The memorial started out at the fire station up on
 6 Highland Avenue a few years ago as an eternal flame,
 7 which was eventually shut off because they couldn't
 8 afford to pay the gas anymore. It was hit by a car and
 9 damaged.
 10 Eventually, when the memorial was moved to Fishel
 11 Park, on numerous occasions, people disrespected it by
 12 using it as a chair. During the construction of the
 13 pavilion, it was removed.
 14 While in storage, something happened to it. I
 15 don't know what. It would be interesting to find out
 16 what because this is a piece of Downers Grove history
 17 that is no longer. All that remains now is this
 18 plaque.
 19 It seems how this plaque is on the ground, it can
 20 still be disrespected. People can walk on it. Leaves
 21 fall on it, and it can be covered in snow, covered in
 22 leaves.

1 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Call to order the May 2nd,
 2 2013 Downers Grove Park District Board Meeting. Roll
 3 call, please.
 4 MS. RANK: Ms. Barr?
 5 COMMISSIONER BARR: Here.
 6 MS. RANK: Mr. Cushing?
 7 COMMISSIONER CUSHING: Here.
 8 MS. RANK: Mr. Gelwicks?
 9 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Here.
 10 MS. RANK: Ms. Mahoney?
 11 COMMISSIONER MAHONEY: Here.
 12 MS. RANK: Mr. Roman?
 13 COMMISSIONER ROMAN: Here.
 14 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Would everyone please rise
 15 for the Pledge of Allegiance.
 16 (WHEREUPON, Pledge of Allegiance
 17 was recited.)
 18 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Do we have any visitors who
 19 would like to address the Board at this time?
 20 Yes, sir. Please stand and give us your name.
 21 MR. WILLIAMS: Steve Williams. I would like to
 22 address the Board regarding the Freedom Memorial Plaque

1 I would like to call on the Board to do the right
 2 thing, remove this plaque from the ground, placed in a
 3 place of honor inside the Veterans Memorial Pavilion on
 4 a wall.
 5 Now, this issue is very important to me. I have a
 6 friend missing in action still from Vietnam. I still
 7 wear his bracelet.
 8 It's not too late to do the right thing. I hope
 9 the Board agrees and gets it moved into the Veterans
 10 Memorial Pavilion. Thank you.
 11 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Thank you.
 12 MR. GILBERT: My name is Mike Gilbert. 4625
 13 Highland in Downers Grove.
 14 Steve told me he was coming tonight to make a few
 15 comments, and I wanted to be sure I joined him. I
 16 would like to add my voice to his in the request to do
 17 something about this.
 18 This plaque was dedicated in 1989. It's been
 19 crashed into, defaced, removed, transplanted, moved;
 20 and kind of now unceremoniously laying in the ground,
 21 as you all know.
 22 Let me give you a little background. My son was

1 Sergeant Thomas M. Gilbert. I think many of you know
2 Tom was killed in Iraq in 2006. So this issue is
3 important to me and my family.

4 As a parent, I have no problem seeing the pain
5 that the Bodden family felt with the loss of their son,
6 but as a Gold Star father, I lived it.

7 We owe these young people the highest amount of
8 respect we can provide them. If we can't provide that
9 respect, then who are we? It is deserved. It is
10 important, and I know we can do a little bit better
11 than what we've got right here now.

12 That plaque should be mounted in a prominent place
13 in the Veterans Memorial, not on the ground the way
14 that it's set up at this particular moment.

15 For the sake of his family, for the sake of our
16 family who feels the pain right with them, for the sake
17 of our children in the community, we need to show a
18 better respect than that plaque is being shown at this
19 particular time.

20 I was there, by the way, in 1989 when the original
21 was dedicated, and it was to be an everlasting flame.
22 It's not everlasting anymore. So I urge the Board to

1 that are memorialized up there. Is there a reason why
2 this shouldn't be there with everybody else from your
3 perspective?

4 MR. WILLIAMS: I think more people would see it at
5 Fishel Park than at Legion Post. Not on the ground.

6 MR. GILBERT: Mr. Bodden is represented at the
7 Legion. This was a plaque that was developed for that
8 sole purpose in 1989. The argument isn't should it be
9 there. It is there. His name is prominently displayed
10 at the hall. But this was a plaque that was
11 particularly dedicated at that time in 1989 for him and
12 in honor of him.

13 The argument, I think, isn't so much -- not that
14 there's an argument. I don't mean to put it that way.
15 But the issue is not so much should there be a plaque
16 to his name, but the plaque that we already have needs
17 to be treated with more respect. It was already
18 dedicated, and it was already presented.

19 Let's take it and put it up inside the pavilion
20 you built there and put it in a more prominent or
21 better place where people can see it.

22 It can be mounted to the wall. It can be mounted

1 take some sort of action, regardless of the cost.

2 I doubt there's a lot of cost involved in this. I
3 would be happy to help if we need to raise some funds
4 to get it accomplished, whatever it takes; but let's
5 treat that plaque with a little more respect.

6 Let's get it mounted up in the memorial, where it
7 belongs, and do him the honor of respecting it. Thank
8 you.

9 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: You're welcome. Can I ask a
10 couple questions.

11 I don't know the whole background behind all of
12 this. I'm under the understanding this was originally
13 placed somewhere else and then got moved to Fishel Park
14 for some reason.

15 MR. WILLIAMS: Right. It was at the fire station
16 on Highland Avenue and was moved to Fishel Park.

17 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: So I understand that we
18 weren't the original resting place for that. It seems
19 to me -- just as one board member, but I would just
20 like to understand your perspective on this -- that
21 there are many memorials to servicemen at Legion Hall
22 and up at the Legion property. There are many people

1 anywhere. The argument more now is that this
2 particular plaque, however it arrived in our hands, is
3 now on the ground, and it's in a disrespectful place.

4 I shouldn't use the term disrespectful place. I
5 know those who put it there meant well, did well.
6 There is no ill will. It's just that it's not in as
7 good of a place as it could be. It isn't being
8 respected to the level that I personally think it
9 should be.

10 Does that answer?

11 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Yes. Thank you. Anybody
12 else? Consent agenda.

13 MR. McADAM: This evening, we have approval of
14 minutes from the April 4, 2013 Regular and Executive
15 Session Meetings and acceptance of the DuPage County
16 Canvass for the Consolidated Election of April 9th,
17 2013.

18 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Motion, please.

19 COMMISSIONER MAHONEY: Move to accept the consent
20 agenda as presented.

21 COMMISSIONER ROMAN: Second.

22 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Roll call, please.

1 MS. RANK: Ms. Mahoney?
 2 COMMISSIONER MAHONEY: Aye.
 3 MS. RANK: Mr. Roman?
 4 COMMISSIONER ROMAN: Aye.
 5 MS. RANK: Ms. Barr?
 6 COMMISSIONER BARR: Aye.
 7 MS. RANK: Mr. Cushing?
 8 COMMISSIONER CUSHING: Aye.
 9 MS. RANK: Mr. Gelwicks?
 10 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Aye. Motion is approved.
 11 MR. McADAM: Our action item for this evening is
 12 request for approval of the SEASPAR Fiscal Year
 13 2013-2014 budget.
 14 The budget is in your pack, as noted in the
 15 information provided. Our contribution is a slight
 16 increase over last year.
 17 As you recall, when we were doing the levy, they
 18 held the levy the same. The slight increase is based
 19 on the calculations of each member agency, particularly
 20 Cook County in the way they calculate on a triennial
 21 and are catching up, and that would have an effect on
 22 us.

1 I have here a plaque for Janet in appreciation for
 2 your service and dedication to the Park Board of the
 3 Downers Grove Park District, Janet Barr, Commissioner
 4 2009 to 2013.
 5 COMMISSIONER BARR: Thank you very much.
 6 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: You're welcome.
 7 (Applause.)
 8 COMMISSIONER BARR: I just want to thank everyone
 9 for their service. Bob, you've done a great job for a
 10 lot of years as President, and Cathy, a long time
 11 Commissioner, in your service to our District, and a
 12 pleasure sitting near you, Matt. And welcome,
 13 Damienne, to the Board, and I think you're going to
 14 have a very good experience. It's a wonderful staff.
 15 So happy to have Bill and Jay on the Board. Thank you
 16 for all you've done.
 17 I'm going on to other volunteer opportunities. If
 18 you ever decide to do a foundation, I would be very
 19 interested in participating.
 20 PRESIDENT GELWICKS: Any other new business? Any
 21 other opportunities for visitors to speak? We have
 22 many of those opportunities tonight. I guess we
