Indoor Facilities

During the COVID-19 health crisis, the Downers Grove Park District has continued serving the community while remaining fiscally responsible by reducing expenses and managing resources including a reduction in staffing.

The Park District will follow guidelines outlined by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Development (DCEO) during Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan. Our priorities will focus on offering programs and camps that meet DCEO guidelines and can be implemented utilizing reduced resources with limited operations. In addition, our team will ensure that facilities are cleaned thoroughly by following safety procedures in areas of facilities open for program usage only. Parks will continue to be maintained at a reduced standard of care. Employees who can work from home will continue to do so.
